Dear Secretary Wright,

On behalf of Oklo Inc., I write to strongly support the State of Oklahoma's response to the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Nuclear Lifecycle Innovation Campus (NLIC) Request for Information.

Oklahoma is my home state. Oklahoma is an energy state, and we want to be the location for the future of fission energy. I see this most directly in my role on the board of the Hamm Institute for American Energy. Nuclear energy is American energy, and once America unlocks the fission lifecycle, tremendous abundance will follow. Oklahoma offers a compelling combination of industrial experience, can-do attitude, and energy leadership to make it fertile ground for the next phase of nuclear development.

Oklo is eager to work with Oklahoma to integrate advanced reactor deployment, used fuel recycling, fuel fabrication and radioisotope production on a single site.

Oklo's model of co-locating power generation with fuel cycle capabilities strengthens domestic fuel security, reduces long-term waste volumes, and enables vertically integrated deployment of advanced reactors. Oklo would be interested in deploying reactors, fuel fabrication, HALEU conversion, recycling of spent nuclear fuel and isotope production at an Oklahoma NLIC site.

The state's central location and robust transportation infrastructure enable secure and efficient movement of materials across the country. Combined with a skilled workforce, the state has major universities, such as my alma mater, University of Oklahoma, and technical and trade programs that could grow a future workforce.

Moreover, the state's pro-energy policy environment and familiarity with complex energy projects support efficient siting, permitting and long-term operations of an advanced nuclear facility.



Oklo would welcome the opportunity to work alongside local, state, and federal partners to further evaluate and invest in Oklahoma.
